Logline

Shahin and Maiti, enthusiastic gym wheel gymnasts, travel by train from Germany to Iran, where they plan to climb the country's highest mountain. During the journey, Shahin tells Maiti in flashbacks about the encounters he had during his journey on foot with his gym wheel from Germany to the USA. This journey, 2,384 miles long, was his art project YavashYavash (SlowlySlowly), with which he built bridges between people and countries, filming his encounters as a one-man cameraman with five professional cameras and creating this unique RollMovie.



Synopsis

The Roll intertwines two parallel journeys, a slow one on foot from east to west - from Aachen to Washington DC - and a fast one from west to east by train - from Aachen to Tehran. The main protagonist, Shahin - an artist, photographer, choreographer -, walks from Aachen (Germany) to Washington DC (USA) rolling an unusual traveling vehicle in front of him: a 2-m high gymnastic wheel. He is traveling with his multi-layered art project YavashYavash (SlowlySlowly) to meet people and encourage them to think about the important issues of our time.

A train journey to Iran to climb Iran's highest mountain serves as a framing element, during which Shahin tells successful gym wheel gymnast and long-time friend Maiti about his encounters and observations. In his RollMovie, he tells us about his encounters: A young couple on the Loire who are preserving an old printing workshop. An organic champagne producer. An artist in Nantes who doesn't think herself one. A mother in Baltimore who provides shelter to a young woman. A couple of bicycle enthusiast in Delaware...



Shahin Tivay Sadatolhosseini

Director, camera, protagonist, writer, producer

Shahin has been working as a freelance photographer, media designer, choreographer and artist in Aachen for 30 years. He has been a gym wheel acrobat since his arrival in Germany as a teenager and has choreographed shows and trained young gymnasts for decades. With his art project RollEast, he walked from Aachen to Tehran with his gym wheel in 2015-2017, and from Aachen to Washington DC in 2021/22, filming this journey professionally.

Producer

Robert is an international actor, writer and producer based in Berlin and London who has been working in film & television since 2014. Some of his credits include films like Mission Impossible: Rogue Nation, From the world of John Wick: Ballerina, Blood & Gold, The Machine and the Oscar winning film 1917. Maiti, a gymnast on the wheel and a physician, has known Shahin since childhood. When she planned a medical internship in Iran, they traveled there together by train. While Maiti reached a high point in her athletic career in 2022 with the Gym Wheel World Championships in Denmark, Shahin cheered her on from afar – and then suggested a joint adventure with another athletic challenge: climbing the highest mountain in Iran.

Anke has been working as a freelance conservator for 30 years in museums worldwide and specializes in the research and conservation of wood paneling in and from Syrian homes. For decades, she has been committed to building bridges between people. She supported Shahin's project and filmed during its course.

Yelena, also a gym wheel gymnast herself, is currently pursuing a degree in Graphic Design at the University of Applied Sciences Aachen, where she is specializing in scriptwriting and filmmaking. Her academic work reflects a talent for communicating complex ideas through visual storytelling.

Director statement Shahin Tivay Sadatolhosseini

I have been a passionate cinephile since my earliest youth, explored cinematic means of expression during my studies as a media designer, followed Iranian, as well as international film art for decades, and have cherished the dream of making a special film since my childhood. My film *The Roll*, in its very own visual language, shall make a difference, make people think, change things for the better in society and on this planet. 30 years of work as a photographer, designer and choreographer have honed my understanding of image composition, visual language, movement, music and sound. All these elements have flowed into the creation of this artistic documentary, my *RollMovie*, and are linked to the theme of the circle, which I have been exploring as an artist for many years and in various visual media.

My endeavor to connect people who live in states that declare themselves great enemies of each other - such as the USA and Iran - and to overcome these externally imposed borders has long been the goal of my work as an artist. As the developments of recent months show: this topic is more relevant than ever.



Producer Statement Robert Maaser

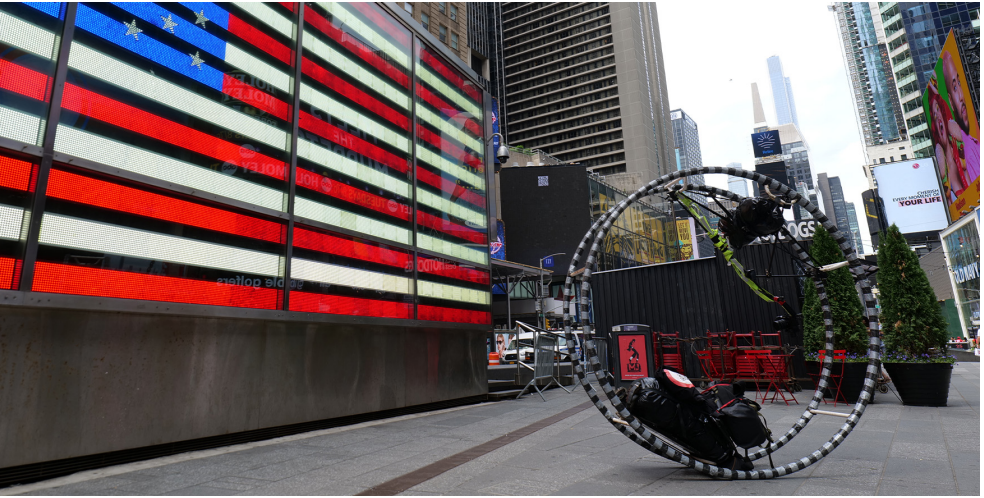
This project combines my childhood with my professional career in the film business. Never have I ever thought of becoming an actor even though I've always been an artist on stage. It's a really rare and beautiful experience that you can combine two completely different chapters of your life with each other. *Gymnastic Wheel* as a sport has been my possibility to travel the world at a very young age learning about different cultures. It was my physical language to communicate with other people without knowing a single word of their language. And in today's world, I want to tell moving stories where love, kindness and respect for each other with a child-like curiosity for all things different are the main message. We're all in this together no matter what you look like, where you're from or what your beliefs are and sometimes people tend to forget that, unfortunately. This project is a gentle reminder that the world is a mix of all colors, not just black and white. And that openness and kindness are the languages everyone understands.

Technical information

Up to five cameras were used (Panasonic Lumix DC-S1H, Panasonic Lumix DC-S5, DJI Mavic 3 Pro Cine, two Go PROs). Shahin mostly filmed the various angles himself, using these five cameras simultaneously. One camera was mounted on a tripod inside the spinning gym wheel, thus capturing the view from inside the gym wheel itself. The footage is consistently high-resolution, mostly filmed in 6K, sometimes in 4K. Drone footage offers breathtaking views of landscapes and surroundings.

The audio recordings are of high quality, thanks to the consistently used professional microphone: recording devices from the Cologne-based brand Tentacle Sync, and a Sony recording device, even during spontaneous conversations.
